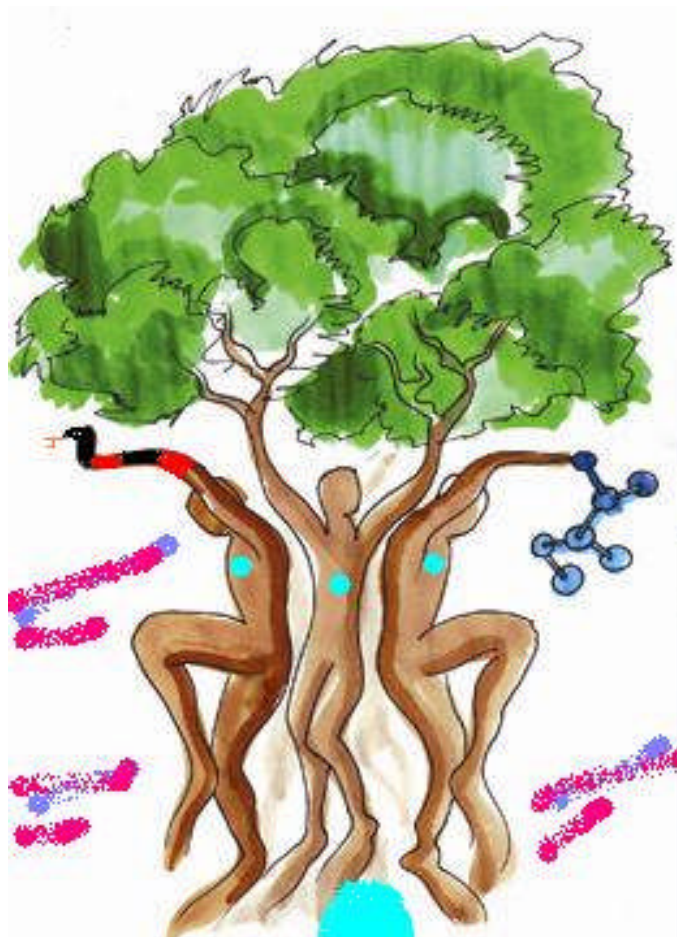

ALTERNATIVE ACCOMMODATION

Bhakti Kutir

This is a little retreat in the Palolem beach area. It comprises nearly 30 huts some made entirely of mud, and others with mud floors but bamboo walls. The huts are rustic but tastefully done, all with electricity and water supply, quaint four post beds with mosquito netting and bits of antique furniture. A porch outside each hut has strung beds and chairs to sit on. There is a restaurant and bar, and they also seem to have yoga, massages, meditation and similar activity happening with regularity. Bamboo walled huts are available @ Rs. 2,500 a night. Mud huts will cost Rs. 3,500 a night.

Sevas Eco friendly Habitat

Just across a little lane from Bhakti Kutir, and priced similarly. They have a variety of mud huts with a restaurant and massage facility as well. The place is as quaint as Bhakti Kutir, but personally felt that the latter is more tastefully done, cooler (more trees) and has a better ambience.

Sea View Resort

Located on Patnem Beach which lies in between the Intercontinental and Palolem Beach. 10 to 15 minutes walk from the Intercontinental. The owner stays on the

premises and seemed simple, friendly and helpful. The non air-conditioned rooms were really very decent, being spacious, clean, in good condition although simple (double bed with dresser and chair, wardrobe, clean bathroom and a little balcony), and value for money. There are cheaper rooms but a little dingy and musty smelling. The resort is quiet and a couple of 100 meters from the beach. The little garden outside also seemed in good shape. AC rooms are also available but February being relatively cool, one might not have the need for air conditioning.

BUDGET ACCOMMODATION

The shacks that usually line the Palolem water front will be up in October after the monsoons are out. A colleague or I will be visiting the area at that time to enquire about rates and bookings for February 2009. Expect them to be priced near about Rs. 500 per night. Please note that the Sea View Resort and some others in that area do have rooms at budget rates. As mentioned above they are a little dingy and smell musty. If you do prefer a room to a shack do let me know and we will try and find you something suitable.

GOA

Variously known as "Pearl of the Orient" and a "Tourist Paradise", the state of Goa is located on the western coast of India in the coastal belt known as Konkan. Internationally renowned for its beaches, Goa is visited by hundreds of thousands of foreign and domestic tourists each year, and has become one of the most popular holiday destinations for European travelers, particularly in the Northern hemisphere winter. Besides beaches, Goa is also known for its world heritage architecture and rich flora and fauna. The people are friendly and hospitable and the place is known for its multicultural lifestyle.. English is widely spoken and the cuisine has been strongly influenced by Portuguese colonists. February is part of the tourist season in Goa, this being the occasion for the famous Goa Carnival, three days of feasting and revelry just before the austere 40 days of Lent. The weather at this time is usually dry and pleasantly cool.

Panaji (Panjim) is the state capital. Goa is serviced by an international/national airport located at Dabolim. There are direct, charter flights for tourists operating from many countries. There are also a number of domestic flights to Goa from Mumbai, New Delhi and other international airports within India. Further, an

intra-state and inter-state bus network also plays an important role in getting locals and visitors.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS

Valid passport and visa. A **tourist visa is adequate, Goa being a popular holiday destination especially in February.**
